

Chapter 16 - Air Conditioner.

Stamps have been required on Air Conditioning equipment for many years. The stamps are hardly to find in a collection, as they are impossible to remove from the units. They are glued very tight to the metal and cannot be removed in 1 piece. The stamps are printed on paper. It is also against the law to remove them from a working unit. The following few stamps are photographs of the stamps still attached to the unit.

Starting around the year 2004, each air conditioner had 2 stamps attached. A FC stamp attached to the Fan Coil unit and a CD stamp attached to the compressor unit.

The fan coil is positioned inside the house and a compressor is typical place outside the house.

The following stamps are printed on plasticized paper. They can be removed from the compressor and fan coil. However, upon removal the word VOID will appear multiple times in a diagonal direction over the stamps.
