

CHAPTER 4 – MATCH TAX.

Thailand introduced its first match tax in 1932 at a rate of 0.25 satang per match-box. This tax was not paid by using stamps, but as a payment from the manufacturer to the tax collectors.

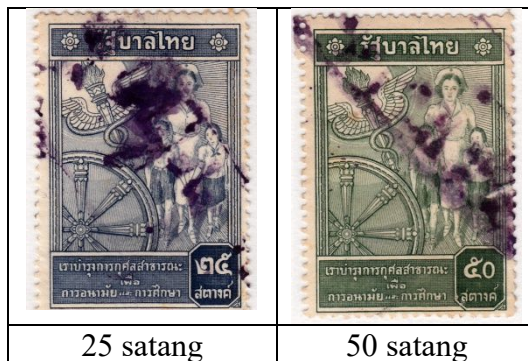
The first printed match stamp was never issued, but was described in the Royal Gazette as beverage stamps (AD-10410.A to AD-10410.F) that were made from this match stamp.

It is described as having a border composed of 2 lines. In the center is a circle with the constitution on a ceremonial bowl. The text at the top reads "Finance Ministry". On each side of the circle is a Garuda in a different color. The words "Match Tax" under the circle. It is believed that this stamp was printed but never issued due to protests of the local match companies. There is no illustration of this stamp.

It was not until 1952 that the Thai government again seriously considered using stamps to pay the match tax to support the health and education program. The rate was fixed at 50 Satang per pack of 10 match boxes. This was again heavily protested and the rate was settled at 25 Satang per pack.

It was decided to use Health and Education stamps for this purpose (see the FD-2020 series in section 13.C). This stamp has not yet been seen on a package but 2 stamps, 25 and 50 satang, are shown at right. They have the typical purple ink smear of match stamp cancellations. This smearing is due to the high volume of millions of packs of matches being canceled by a rubber stamp, which wears out very quickly.

13.C - Charity for Health & Education
Issued – 1953
 Printed by Thomas De La Rue & Company, Ltd. in sheets of 2 panes of 50 stamps each. The panes are separated by a 20mm wide horizontal gutter. There is an imprint in the horizontal gutter.

Above 2 stamps are the only 2 values used for match purposes. The complete set of 9 stamps is listed in Documentary stamps, chapter 13.

13D - Standing Buddha
 Issued January 2500 or 1957
 Printer – Government Printing Bureau, Tokyo.

Sometime after 1957, the Health and Education stamps were replaced by the Standing Buddha stamps. These stamps were issued to celebrate 2500 years of Buddha

These stamps were surcharged 50 Satang and the logo of the KSS charity program. Again, the tax was hidden under the guise of a charity program. These stamps are listed as FD-2041, FD-2042 and FD-2044. It is believed that the first 2 stamps were uniquely used for match purposes while FD-2044 can also be found on documents.

6.A - Social Security

Printer – American Banknote Co.
 Issued - April 1955
 Size - 20.5 x 25 mm

Around 1964, Social Security stamps were surcharged 50 satang and used as match stamps, again as a charity "tax" contribution. These stamps are listed as FS-1101, FS-1102, F-1103 and FS-1104. The surcharged Social Security stamps were exclusively used as match tax stamps.

4A - Provisional match on non- alcoholic beverage stamp.

Beverage stamp issued November 1959
 Surcharge done in July 1965
 Size 12x 96 mm.

In July 1965, the government decided to abandon all so-called charity programs, and introduce a proper revenue tax stamp for match tax. Because the stocks of social security stamps were exhausted and the new stamps had not arrived yet, on September 7, 1965, a green soft drink stamp (ND-30010) was overprinted as provisional match stamp in 4 different quantities of matches. These stamps were only used for a few months until the final design became available in December 1965. They are amongst the rarest Thai revenue stamps.

All above 4 stamps have a black overprint on a deep yellow green beverage stamp.

All three stamps shown have a purple handstamp in the middle of the stamp reading “sample”.

Actual Match Tax stamps.


The first actual match revenue stamps were issued in December 1965.

Two different printers were used, Bradbury Wilkinson (MT-0110) and Tokyo government printing bureau (MT-0115). The stamps can easily be differentiated by the width of the printed area, 24 millimeters for the Bradbury Wilkinson and 25 millimeters for the Tokyo Government bureau.

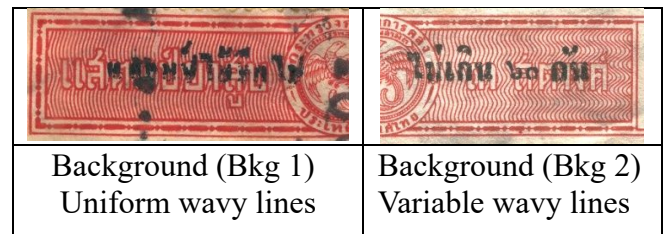

This stamp – which includes the country name - is very clearly described in a Royal Gazette announcement on 10 June 2517 (1974), as having been issued at that time. A note at the end of the Gazette announcement says these stamps were issued to be different from those currently in use.

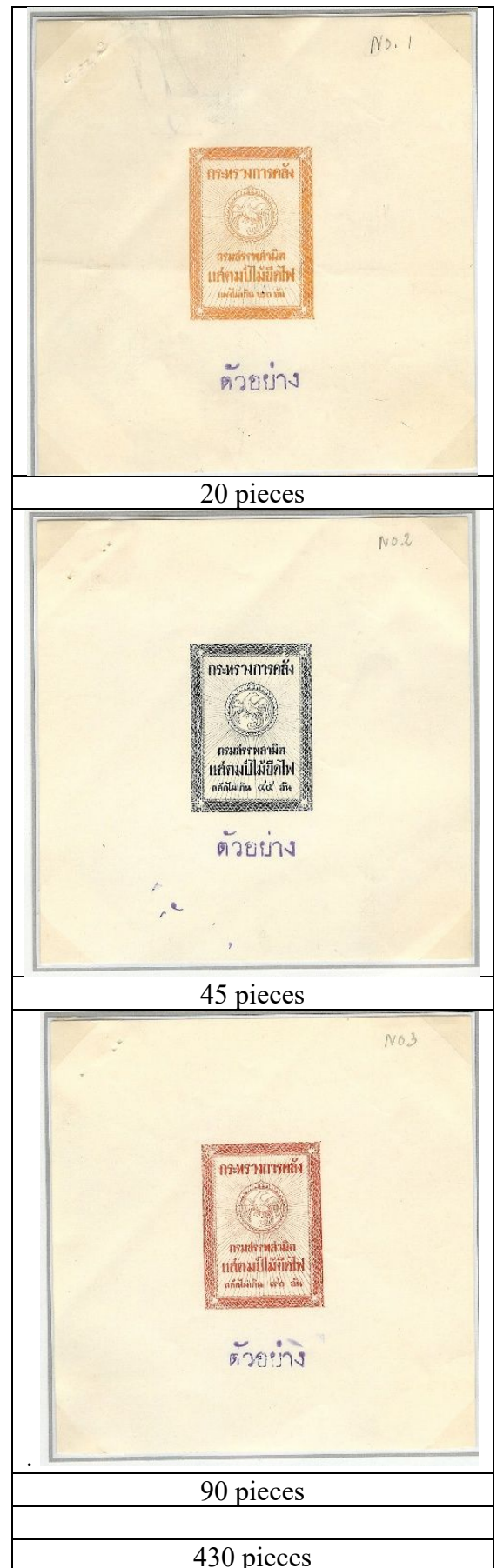

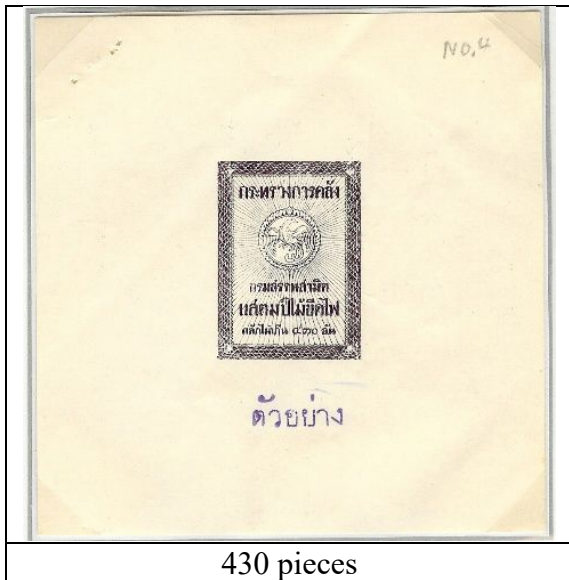
